Giuseppe Verdi was born at Roncole, October 9th, 1813. "Il Trovatore" was first performed in Rome on the 19th January, 1853, and was an immediate and lasting success. The first musical signs made by Verdi were ominous. They were in connection with the street organ—and all the world knows what it has subsequently suffered from Verdi being on the street organs. An itinerant organ grinder used to come betimes to the Roncole Inn, where little Verdi would run to stand and gaze in wonderment of the musician and his music; nor would he leave the attraction until fetched away.

Jean Sibelius is the first Finnish composer to achieve European distinction. "Finlandia" so electrified his countrymen by rousing a dormant patriotism to the sense of its wrongs, that the despotic Russian Government forbade the performance of the work throughout Finland as being highly inflammable, and calculated to injure Russian interests. It has thus been manifestly invested with a symbolical significance. A sense of feverish unrest and burning energy characterises the greater part of the composition.
