Franz von Suppe was born at Speleto, in Dalmatia, in 1820, and died in 1895. Though he wrote a symphony, a mass, overtures, and chamber music, he is best remembered as a composer of comic operas.

- 4 FANTASIA on the Works of ... *Haydn*

Joseph Haydn was born of poor parents in the village of Rohrau on the Austrian frontier. His first step in a long musical career was in the capacity of a chorister in the Cathedral of St. Stephens at Vienna. It is said that Haydn practised at least sixteen hours a day on the violin. The above selection introduces — Adagio, 2nd Symphony, Allegro Spiritoso, Finale 2nd Symphony, Extract from 7th Symphony, Minuetto 11th Symphony, Recitative from The Creation, Finale 4th Symphony.
