L. G. F. Herold was born in Paris in 1791, entered the Conservatoire in 1806, and won the Prix de Rome, 1812. His proved to be a successful operatic career, and lasted practically till his death in 1833. This overture is more in the nature of a selection from melodies in the opera than an overture in its true sense.

Charles Francois Gounod was born in Paris June 17th, 1818, his mother being not unknown as a pianist. He entered the Conservatoire of that city at the age of eighteen, where he studied under Halevy and others, and very shortly achieved distinction by reason of his two cantatas, entitled "Marie Stuart et Rigio" and "Fernand." He was Organist and Maitre de Chapelle at the "Mission Arengéro," while for two years studied for the priesthood.

William Vincent Wallace, composer, pianist and violinist, was born in Waterford, on June 1st, 1814. He was the son of Scottish parents, his father being an army bandmaster and bassoon player. On the removal of the family to Dublin, young Wallace frequently appeared at concerts as a violinist, from 1829, and in 1834 he played a Concerto of his own composition at a concert. In about the year 1836 he went to Australia, and travelled from there to New Zealand, India and South America. He appeared in London in 1845 and produced his operas, but soon after resumed his wanderings, this time visiting the United States as well as South America. He died at the Chateau de Bagen, Haute Garonne, France, October 12th, 1865.
