A Potpourri of the fascinating airs which have haunted the memories of music lovers during the past fifty years. The tunes range from grave to gay and lively to severe, and indicate to some extent the variations which have taken place in the public taste during the past half century. The Potpourri was performed with the greatest success at 400 consecutive performances at the Palace Theatre, London—an unprecedented record—and although the idea has since had many imitators in this country, these imitations have never had the same acceptance as this.
