*It is interesting to note that this Band holds a unique record amongst brass bands. On April 9th, 1936, they were presented with an illuminated address to commemorate a record achievement in winning eleven first prizes in succession in the contesting years 1933-4, and 1934-5, nine of which were under the rules of the London and Home Counties Amateur Bands Association, and two at the National Bands Festival at the Crystal Palace. In making the presentation Mr. H. H. Thomas, (Secretary of the L. and H.C.A.B.A.) said that it would probably be many a long year before this phenomenal run of successes was beaten.*

*The Band also created a record by securing 100% of the points possible in winning the Association 1st Section Championship in the contesting year 1934-5.*

*Since their promotion to the Championship Section, the Band has secured six prizes (four seconds and two thirds) from seven contests—truly a wonderful performance for their first season in the Championship. This achievement won for them the runners-up position in the Association Championship 1935-6, and also gave them the distinction of representing the Association at a contest to be held for the League Championship of Great Britain in the Granby Halls, Leicester, on Saturday, October 31st, 1936.*

*The Band will give their first public performance of the test piece — a Symphonic Legend "Princess Nada" by Denis Wright during the programme on Sunday afternoon.*

*The Conductor for this occasion will be Mr. Geo. Thompson, B.B.C.M., L.G.S.M. (Bandmaster) a very talented young man who has studied brass banding in all its phases under such renowned men as Mr. W. Rimmer, Geo. Hawkins, Denis Wright, Mus. Bac., etc., and has won his diplomas through the Brass Bandsmen's College of Music, and London Guildhall School of Music.*
