In Hardrow Scar Grounds there is a

MAGNIFICENT WATERFALL

situated at the extremity of a deep, narrow, rocky gully, along which the stream winds amongst detached masses of rock; an immense column of Water ONE HUNDRED FEET HIGH being projected from the edge of a rock, so as to detach itself completely from the strata beneath, and plunge without dispersion or interruption into a black and boiling cauldron below. The fall is thrown forward in such a manner that a good carriage road might be made behind the Fall, in consequence of the action of the air having decomposed the shale underlying the gill and limestone. The grounds are laid out with extensive walks, and contain several other beautiful features.
