

TWO CHAMPIONSHIP BANDS OF THE WESSEX BRASS BAND ASSOCIATION.

Salisbury City Silver Band, formed in 1934, is known to many lovers of Brass Bands inside and outside of the City as a pre-war Broadcasting Band, and twice, Champions of W.B.B.A. Many friends were also made by their famous pre-war Celebrity Concerts which introduced to Salisbury such Stars as Jack Mackintosh, Trumpet; B.B.C., Chris Devenport, "The Trombone Wizard; Arthur Askey, Comedian; Ronald Gorley, The Blind Pianist; Esta Coleman, and others.

Like other combinations, the Band has not yet fully recovered from the long years of the war, and is still under strength as a result, but, with the continued support of the citizens of Salisbury, and our friends from far and near, the Musicians of this Band will once again re-produce its past status.

Woodfalls Silver Band is known up and down the Country as a fine Contesting Band. The present combination includes the personnel of the famous Woodfalls Boys' Band, who as such, was also a competing Band of the Wessex Brass Band Association.

As present Champions of the Association, the Band won their right at the Exeter Daily Herald Contest to compete at Belle Vue, Manchester, against some well known Works and Colliery Bands of Wales and the North of England. Although not in the prizes at Belle Vue, it was obvious to all that this Band will be well to the fore in the future, if the present rate of progress is maintained.

Rivals in Contests, the two Bands have great pleasure in joining hands for this noble cause.
