HE Fairey Aviation Works' Band can be correctly described as youngsters in the Brass Band Movement of Great Britain.

Formed only in 1937 at the instigation of Major T. M. Barlow, M.Inst.C.E., M.I.Mech.E., F.R.Ae.S., then Director managing the Stockport factories, the band soon came into prominence by obtaining the Premier Award at Belle Vue, Manchester, in July, 1938.

Harry Mortimer, the celebrated British Cornettist, has held the position of Musical Director since its formation, and the achievements of this combination under his directorship has been the envy of all Brass Band enthusiasts. British Championship winners in 1941, 42 and 44, runners-up in 1943, Open British Marching Champions 1942, West of England Champions 1944, is a sequence of honours to which few bands, in the long history of the Brass Band Movement, can claim.

It may also be interesting to the audience to know that the band has just completed their 100th broadcast, and in addition have contributed to the entertainment of H.M. Forces on 92 occasions.

It would be invidious to single out any individual in the band, but mention of the soloists who have held their position with distinction will not detract from the capabilities of the other members.

The audience may also like to know that every member of the band is an employee in the Fairey Aviation Works at Stockport. In their capacity as fitters, inspectors, machinists, etc., these bandsmen have contributed in the construction of Fairey Battles, Fulmars, Beaufighters and Barracudas for the Fleet Air Arm, also the Halifax machine in the heavy bomber group, all of which played a most conspicuous part in Naval and Land Warfare.

The members of the band ask you to accept this programme, with their good wishes, as a memoir of their visit.

We are frequently requested by members of the audience to play items for which they have a special regard. Being unable to transport our complete repertoire we have brought with us a variable selection of music.
